GALA: JASON JONES TAKES THE PRO-LIFE FIGHT SERIOUSLY

Jason Jones is far from your ordinary pro-life speaker. A mixed martial arts buff (particularly Muay Thai), Jason has gone from being a teen parent to being one of the most effective pro-life and culture warriors in the nation.

When he was just 17, his first child was lost to abortion when his girlfriend's father forced her to have an abortion. That set Jason on the path to ending abortion, which remains his life's ambition.

HOPE FOR THE HOPELESS: CHOOSING LIFE AND EDUCATION

One of the most rewarding things about the work we do at the Warrenton Pregnancy Center is aiding the vulnerable. Turning a woman's anxiety about an unplanned pregnancy into hope and joy injects immeasurable optimism into our work.

A recent client in her early 20s came to us in February with a tremendous amount of stress. She was not completely set on having an abortion, but it was one of the options she was weighing.

After meeting with one of our client advocates, this young lady was encouraged by the options we presented her with: The prospect of furthering her education through

our programs and/or the idea of carrying her baby to term at a local home maternity home. As of this newsletter going to press, she is nearly five months along, living at a maternity home, and enrolled in educational programs that will serve her and her child well.

Your prayerful and financial support of our ministry not only allows us to counsel clients to make the best choices for themselves and their families, but the grace of your prayers softens the hearts of those who are leaning toward abortion.

'CHOOSE LIFE' SAVES LIVES

Years ago, long before I moved to Virginia, I decided to buy the "Choose Life" license plates for all of my vehicles simply because of my pro-life convictions.



What I didn't know then is that my "choice" of tag sent some money to my local pregnancy center. The cost of the plate is \$25, of which \$20 goes to the cause.

In Virginia, the state's DMV sends a check for the funds collected from Choose Life plates to Heartbeat International (WPC is an affiliate). Heartbeat then distributes the funds to Virginia pregnancy centers that have opted in, whether or not they are an affiliate. In 2020, our cut was over \$2,000.

Right now, 33 states have pro-life license plates available. Between 2000 and 2020, more than 650,000 Choose Life plates were sold or renewed, raising over \$13 million for crisis pregnancy centers like ours.

As of 2019, Virginia's Choose Life plates have either been sold or renewed 44,084 times with a total of 5,408 Choose Life plates on our roads. This revenue stream has provided \$754,695 to Heartbeat International-affiliated clinics in Virginia

If you already have Choose Life plates on all your vehicles, thank you! Encourage your

family and friends to get them. Every little bit helps to save women and children from the violence of abortion.
