ultrasounds, diapers, clothing, cribs, car seats, and formula. Your support has allowed us to increase our staffing from two to four. It's also allow us to expand our events, community presence, and service offerings.

A few weeks ago, a retired medical doctor told us she wanted to volunteer. While we're still working out the details, this seems to be an answered prayer. The free clinic in Warrenton does not offer pre-natal care or OB/GYN services. One of my longer-term goals for the Warrenton Pregnancy Center is to offer those services for our clients at least one day a week.

If we're to succeed in expanding our services

as we grow, we'll need the support of our community more than ever. I'm confident we'll succeed because God always comes through for those who honor him and humble themselves before him.

COME GROW WITH US GALA FEATURING MISS AMERICA 2001

Angela Grey has known victory and heartache, and she's borne it all with grace thanks to her deep faith in God. She will

keynote our 2022 "Come Grow With Us" Gala on April 29 at the Inn at Vint Hill.

As Miss America 2001, Grey became the first Asian-American woman to win the crown. She spent a year crisscrossing the nation, and now works as the

principal of a Catholic school in Los Angeles. Her personal goal is to empower good teachers and protect children from being shuffled from school to school.

As one of 10 children born to immigrant parents in Hawaii, Angela has also known tragedy. Four years after winning the Miss America crown, her beloved younger brother, Albert, committed suicide. Angela is also a breast cancer survivor.

The passionately pro-life mother of five promotes the idea of "whole life," emphasizing the intrinsic dignity of the human person from natural conception to natural death. After her brother's suicide in 2006, Angela spoke even more forcefully on pro-life issues and the importance of faith and family. She is the author of the inspirational memoir, *Amazing Win, Amazing Loss: Miss America Living Happily, Even After*.

"I cannot wait to share my story with the supporters of the Warrenton Pregnancy Center," she said. "Despite the doom and gloom of COVID and the politicization of everyting in our culture, there are so many

good and hopeful things happening in our country."
